PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

The weather forecast for the next week in South Georgia calls for low temperatures in the low 40s to low 60s, highs in the low 60s to upper 70s, and a 60-80% chance of precipitation on Wednesday, December 2, and a 10-20% chance of precipitation on Monday, December 7 and Tuesday, December 8.

The weather forecast for the next week in Central and North Georgia calls for low temperatures in the upper 30s to low 60s, highs in the low 60s to upper 70s, and an 80% chance of precipitation on Wednesday, December 2, and a 10-40% chance of precipitation from Sunday, December 6 through Tuesday, December 8.

Buying interest is active for export quality pecans and for good quality pecans. For the wholesale and gift pack trade demand is strong as the holiday season approaches. There is a wide range in quality of pecans, as a result of wet weather conditions and continuing warm weather. Rot and smaller nut size have been reported.

Blends in both small and large lots of generally good quality with meat yields of 39-44% sold for about \$3.65-3.86 per point. Schley Blends of gift pack quality with at least 50% meat yields sold for about \$4.00-4.15 per point. Stuart Blends with meat yields of 40-43% sold for about \$3.70-4.15 per point. (To get price per pound use this formula: dollars per point times meat yield = cents per pound; to get per point figure: dollars per pound divided by meat yield = dollars per point).

Prices paid to growers (Tuesday, November 24 through Tuesday, December 1, 2015) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality pecans in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

LOUISIANA (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

The weather forecast for the next week calls for low temperatures ranging from the mid-30s to low 50s, and high temperatures ranging from the mid-50s to mid-60s. There is a 20-50% chance of precipitation on Tuesday, December 1, and a 10% chance of precipitation from Wednesday, December 2 through Tuesday, December 8.

Deliveries for Improved varieties have been very light with most of the crop sold as retail. Buying interest is good for in-shell gift pack, retail use and for commercial sheller use, however the lack of volume has shellers purchasing from other production areas until more pecans become available. A wide range in quality, including sprouting and embryo rot, has been reported.

Prices paid to growers (Tuesday, November 24, 2015 though Tuesday, December 1) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound inshell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

Stuart (deliveries very light) 40-44% meat yield 150-180 mostly 160-170 occasional lower

TEXAS (via Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were very light. Demand was fairly good for good quality pecans. Pawnee, Cheyenne and Choctaw currently being harvested, as well as Natives. Harvesting is expected to increase during the weeks leading up to Christmas.

The weather forecast for the next week calls for low temperatures ranging from the Low 30s to low 50s, and highs from the mid-50s to upper 60s. There is up to a 40% chance of precipitation on Tuesday, December 1, and a 10-40% chance projected between Saturday, December 5 and Tuesday, December 8.

Buying interest displayed by end users was fairly good for inshell, gift

pack use, and moderate for commercial sheller use as shellers utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas or wait for additional availability of nuts. Trading was moderate for in-shell and gift pack uses.

Choctaw (deliveries very light) 50-55% meat yield or better 200-260 mostly 225-250 occasional lower

Natives (deliveries very light) yard tree lots 50-80 mostly 55-70; machine picked 100-125 mostly 100-110

Pawnee (deliveries very light) 50-55% meat yield or better 200-260 mostly 225-250 occasional lower
