PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

Weather conditions in South and Central Georgia through the weekend call for temperatures from the upper 30s through the upper 70s, with up to an 80 percent chance of precipitation on Sunday, December 18. Northern areas have much colder temperatures expected, ranging from the low 20s to the upper 50s, with up to 100 percent chance of precipitation on Saturday, December 17 and Sunday, December 18.

Demand is good for the export, domestic and retail gift-pack business. Offerings were light at the delivery buying points. Most of the lots were comprised of Blends with a few Improved Varieties hitting the market. Buyers for the export trade are still looking for export quality pecans to be shipped in January.

Lots of Blends with 46-49% meat yield (nut count under 75) sold in a range of about \$5.84-6.04 per point occasional higher and lower. Lots of Blends with 47-55% meat yield (nut count 75-82) sold in a range of about \$4.82-5.10 per point occasional higher and lower.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon Tuesday, December 13, through late afternoon Thursday, December 15, 2016) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

OKLAHOMA (via: Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Market News Service)

Deliveries by growers to buying points light in central and southern counties, mostly moderate in northern Oklahoma. Very few truckload lots confirmed sold this week with most sales in 1,000-2,000 lb. lots. Higher door prices are prompting renewed interest in hand-picking but overall volumes are very light. Harvest continues active in the northern half of the state. A winter storm is forecast for the weekend and is expected to halt harvest at least briefly.

The weather forecast this week calling for highs in the upper 60s Friday but falling to the low 20s to low 40s the remainder of the week. Lows are forecast from single digits to low 30s.

Prices are higher for natives, no sales confirmed on Improved varieties. Demand was very good for natives.

Prices paid to growers (as of noon Thursday, December 8, 2016 to noon Thursday, December 15, 2016) at buyers delivery points or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound, in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.
