PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

Weather conditions in most areas of Georgia this week call for temperature lows in the low 30s and 40s to highs in the high 50s to low 60s with a slight chance of precipitation today. The most southern parts of the state will have the warmer end of the readings for this week.

Demand is good for the export, domestic and retail gift-pack business. Offerings were very light at the delivery buying points. Most of the lots were comprised of Blends with very few Improved Varieties hitting the market this week. Rain and wet conditions in the orchards have curtailed harvest and most growers are trying to finish up with the third pass through.

Buyers for the export trade are still looking for export quality pecans to be shipped in January. Small lots of Blends with 43-54.2% meat yield (nut count under 70) sold in wide a range of about \$5.20-6.16 per point. Large lots of Blends with 48-52% meat yield (nut count under 70) sold in a wide range of about \$5.38-5.97 per point. B grade and cracked lots sold well however prices are only reported for generally good quality in-shell pecans.

LOUISIANA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

Deliveries were very light. The weather for the next three days calls for temperature lows in the low-40s to low-50s and highs in the mid-40s to mid-50s with a 10-20 percent chance of precipitation on Thursday.

Most of the deliveries were Natives with very few Improved varieties hitting the market this week. Demand is good and sales are strong for the retail and gift pack trade. A wide range in quality has been reported. Prices are about steady.

Prices paid to growers (Tuesday, December 13, 2016 through late afternoon Tuesday, December 20, 2016) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

TEXAS (Central, South, Eastern Areas) (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points were light. Demand was fairly good for good quality pecans. Natives are currently being harvested. Harvesting is expected to remain steady during the days leading up to Christmas.

The weather forecast for the next week calls for temperature lows ranging from the mid-30s to mid-60s, and highs from the low 50s to mid-70s. There is a chance of precipitation across most parts of the state from Friday, December 23 through Sunday, December 25.

Demand was good for the retail and gift pack trade. Buyers have been making purchases from other production areas or are waiting for additional availability of pecans. Prices for Natives are higher.

Prices paid to growers (noon Tuesday, December 13, 2016 through noon Tuesday, December 20, 2016) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

Natives (deliveries very light) machine harvested 125-200 mostly 150-180 occasional higher; yard tree lots 100-150 mostly 120-130

WESTERN REGION ARIZONA, NEW MEXICO AND WEST TEXAS (via Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were fairly light. Demand was very good for good quality pecans. Harvested quality has been generally good.

The weather forecast for the next week calls for low temperatures in the mid-20s to upper 40s, with highs in the low 40s to low 70s. A chance of precipitation is projected across most areas in the region every day from Wednesday, December 21 through Sunday, December 25. The greatest chance of precipitation is on Thursday, December 22, at from 50-90 percent.

Buying interest displayed by end users was active for in-shell, gift pack use, and fairly active for commercial sheller use as shellers continue to utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas or wait for additional availability of nuts. Trading was good for in-shell and gift pack uses. Deliveries and purchases of Improved varieties mostly Western Schley were moderate.

Prices paid to growers (from Tuesday, December 13, 2016 through Tuesday, December 20, 2016) at buyers delivery point or f.o.b. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality pecans in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

Western Schley 55-58% meat yield 291-331 mostly 297-325 occasional higher and lower

Formula for Dollar per point and Cents per Pound:

Cents per pound divided by meat yield equals DOLLAR PER POINT Dollar per point times meat yield equals CENTS PER POUND
