PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park, Georgia) Atlanta

Temperatures varied throughout the state with lows in the high 20s and mid 30s in the northern areas and mid 30s to mid 40s in the central and southern areas. Daytime temps ranged from the mid 40s to mid 50s in most areas. Rain came through the state at different times with some areas very heavy.

Very light offerings were delivered this period and most were Blends. Prices were about steady. Small and large lots of Blends with meat yields of 45% or higher sold in a range of about \$2.83-3.49 mostly \$3.20-3.30 per point. Many growers are waiting to see if the prices will strengthen by mid January and then decide whether or not to put their remaining pecans in cold storage and sell them at a later date.

Buying interest and trading by end users is very slow for export business, shellers and accumulators. Most of the shellers are closed until January 6, 2014 because of the holidays. Gift pack and retail business has slowed

considerably now that the holiday sales rush is over. Some end users are utilizing inventories on hand, or have been purchasing from other areas.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon Thursday, December 19 through late afternoon Tuesday, December 31, 2013) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

Improved Varieties deliveries insufficient to establish market **Seedlings** machine harvested 40% meat yield or better 85-100 mostly 85-90, yard tree lots 60-85 mostly 75

LOUISIANA - Via: Forest Park, Georgia (Atlanta) (LA report will be issued once weekly-usually on Tuesdays)

This report was issued on Tuesday, December 31, 2013

Deliveries for Improved varieties were insufficient to establish market. Most of the movement is from retail sales and gift pack business. Some growers are awaiting price offers for pecans that had been graded and tested earlier.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon Tuesday, December 17, 2013 through late afternoon Tuesday, December 31, 2013) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound inshell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds mostly 5,000 or less unless otherwise stated.

Natives/Seedlings (deliveries very light) machine harvested 40% meat yield or better 90-105 yard tree lots 80

TEXAS - CENTRAL, SOUTH, EASTERN areas (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were very light. Demand was moderate for good quality pecans. Natives are currently being harvested. Prices are about steady.

Crops generally are of good quality. Harvesting has been light, but is expected to increase due to the return to regular work schedules following the holiday season, as well as a warming in temperatures. Some areas of the state are over 90 percent done with harvesting.

The weather forecast for the balance of the week calls for low temperatures in the upper 20s to low 50s, with highs in the low 50s to upper 60s. There is a chance of precipitation projected every day from Wednesday, January 1 through Sunday, January 5, with up to a 60% chance of precipitation on Wednesday and Saturday. No precipitation is expected on Tuesday, December 31.

Buying interest displayed by end users was fairly slow for in-shell gift pack use. Trading was slow. Buying interest is slow for commercial sheller use as shellers continue to utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas.

Prices paid to growers at Texas delivery points or F.O.B. the orchard from noon Thursday, December 19, 2013 to noon Tuesday, December 31, 2013 cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

Natives machine harvested 70-110 mostly 80, yard tree lots 50-70 mostly 50-55

OKLAHOMA (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to buying points for both Improved varieties and for Natives was light. Demand and harvesting has been light. Harvesting is expected to increase later this week, with the end to the holiday work schedule, as well as dryer weather conditions.

The weather forecast for the balance of the week calls for temperature highs from the low 30s to the mid 50s, and temperature lows from the low 20s to the low 40s. There is a slight chance of precipitation the rest of the week, with as high as a 20% chance on Saturday, January 4. There is no precipitation projected for Tuesday, Thursday or Sunday this week.

Offerings this period were mostly Blends. Prices for Blends with meat yields of 45-52% were \$2.50-3.00 mostly \$2.75 per point occasional higher and lower. Some growers have opted to put their remaining pecans in cold storage and plan to sell them at a later date.

Buying interest displayed by end users was fairly slow for retail in-shell gift pack use, and for commercial sheller use as shellers utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas, as well as wait for additional availability of nuts. Trading was fairly slow for in-shell and gift pack uses. Prices are about steady.

Prices paid to growers at Oklahoma delivery points or F.O.B. the orchard from noon Thursday, December 19, 2013 to noon Tuesday, December 31, 2013 cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

Natives machine harvested 90-100, yard tree lots 50-80 mostly 60-70

WESTERN REGION - ARIZONA, NEW MEXICO AND WEST TEXAS (via Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were very light. Demand was fairly light for good quality pecans. Harvesting continues in all areas, and is now approximately 50-60% complete in some areas. Harvesting is expected to increase in all areas, with the return to post holiday work schedules, and a projected week stretch of dry weather.

Harvested quality has been generally good. Prices are about steady.

The weather forecast for the balance of the week calls for low temperatures in the mid 20s to upper 30s, with highs in the mid 50s to mid 60s. Little or no precipitation is projected for the rest of the week.

Buying interest displayed by end users was slow for in-shell, gift pack use, and commercial sheller use as shellers continue to utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas or wait for additional availability of nuts. Trading was fairly slow for in-shell and gift pack uses. Deliveries and purchases of Improved varieties mostly Western Schley, with a few lots of Pawnee were fairly light.

Prices paid to growers (from noon Thursday, December 19, 2013 through noon Tuesday, December 31, 2013) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality pecans in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.
