PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta, GA)

Deliveries were light and the market is about steady for Improved varieties and Blends. Interest from the commercial shellers and accumulators for domestic trading and from the export market is moderate; while retail gift-pack businesses are active. Trading is moderate to slow. A few growers have decided to put offerings of export quality pecans into cold storage until the price improves. Most growers expect the harvest to be finished by the Christmas break, weather permitting.

Weather conditions in South Georgia for the week shows a cooling trend starting tonight with lows in the low 30s to mid-40s and daytime highs in the mid-40s to low 50s. In the Central and Northern areas of the state the forecast is much cooler with freeze warnings for December 8-10 and rain expected for December 6-9 for the state.

Small lots of Blends with Desirables and 56-59% meat yield sold in a range of about \$4.69-4.73 per point. Other small lots of Blends with 51-55% meat yield sold in a range of about \$4.65-4.81 per point. Large lots of Blends with 45-52% meat yield sold in a range of about \$4.73-4.81 per point. Large lots of Blends with Seedlings sold for about \$4.60 per point.

LOUISIANA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta, GA)

Growers are busy preparing their pecans for market. Very light deliveries with more lots expecting to be available later this week. The market is about steady. Most of the sales are sold for retail off the farm.

The weather forecast throughout most of the state for this week calls for cooler temperatures with lows in the mid-30s to low 40s and highs in the high 40s to high 50s. Rain is expected from December 6-10.

OKLAHOMA (via: Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Market News Service)

Pecan harvesting was moderate to active with dry and above average temperatures favorable. Marketing statewide mostly moderate to active with deliveries by growers to buying points mostly moderate to active. Sheller demand mostly moderate through the week. Highly variable quality of offerings continues to be a major concern for buyers. Low yielding offerings are showing up in all areas and demand for these is limited.

The weather forecast this week calling for highs in low 60s to upper 40s and lows in mid 30s to mid 20s.

TEXAS (Central, South, Eastern Areas)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points were light. Demand was good for good quality pecans. Harvesting is expected to remain about steady this week, and to increase next week. Much buying interest continues for the export trade to China.

Demand was fairly good for the retail and gift pack trade. Due to continued light volumes, buyers are making purchases from other production areas or are waiting for additional availability of pecans.

Weather forecast for this week shows lows in the upper 20s to low 40s and highs in the low 40s to low 70s. On Wednesday, December 6, there is a 40-100 percent chance of precipitation across most of the state.

The formula used to determine Dollar per Point:

CENTS PER POUND DIVIDED BY MEAT YIELD EQUALS DOLLAR PER POINT

DOLLAR PER POINT TIME MEAT YIELD EQUALS CENTS PER POUND
