PECANS-PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

OKLAHOMA PECAN REPORT (via Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to buying points were moderate. Demand was moderate. The size of the pecans this year are smaller than normal due to drought conditions over the last two years.

The weather forecast for the balance of the week calls for temperature highs from the low 40s to upper 60s, with low temperatures in the low 20s to upper 30s. A ten to twenty percent chance of precipitation is projected for most of the remainder of the week.

Buying interest displayed by end users was fairly light for retail inshell, gift pack use, and moderate for commercial sheller use as shellers utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas. Trading was fairly slow for in-shell and gift pack uses.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon Thursday, February 14, 2013 thru late afternoon Thursday, February 21, 2013) at buyers delivery point or f.o.b. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality pecans in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

Natives (deliveries light) too few to establish a market.

ARIZONA, NEW MEXICO AND WEST TEXAS (via Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were moderate. Demand was moderate for good quality pecans. Prices were higher. Approximately 90-95 percent of this season's crop has been harvested. Deliveries of nuts are expected to continue until the end of February or early March. The weather forecast for the balance of the week calls for low temperatures in the low 20s to low 40s, with highs in the low 50s to low 60s. A ten percent chance of precipitation is projected for Thursday, February 21 and Sunday, February 24, with no precipitation projected for Friday or Saturday.

Buying interest displayed by end users was fairly light for in-shell, gift pack use, and moderate for commercial sheller use as shellers continue to utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas. Some growers are delaying making marketing decisions, opting to concentrate on harvesting and accumulating supplies for sale at a later date. Trading was slow for in-shell and gift pack uses. Deliveries and purchases of Improved varieties mostly Western Schley were moderate. Interest from the export trade business to China, as well as Europe, has been shown by prospective buyers.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon Thursday, February 14, 2013 through late afternoon Thursday, February 21, 2013) at buyers delivery point or f.o.b. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality pecans in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

Western Schley 54-58% meat yield 135-160, mostly 150-160 occasional higher and lower.
