#### OKLAHOMA PECAN REPORT (via Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to buying points were moderate. Demand was fairly light. Prices were about steady. The size of the pecans this year are smaller than normal due to drought conditions over the last two years.

The weather forecast for the balance of the week calls for temperature highs from the low 50s to mid-70s, with low temperatures in the mid-30s to low 50s. A twenty percent chance of precipitation is projected for Thursday, Saturday and Sunday this week, with no precipitation projected for Friday, February 8.

Buying interest displayed by end users was fairly light for retail inshell, gift pack use, and moderate for commercial sheller use. Many shellers are utilizing inventories on hand or making purchases from other production areas, as well as waiting for additional availability of nuts. Trading was fairly slow for in-shell and gift pack uses.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon Tuesday, February 5, 2013 thru late afternoon Thursday, February 7, 2013) at buyers delivery point or f.o.b. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality pecans in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

## ARIZONA, NEW MEXICO AND WEST TEXAS (via Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were moderate. Demand was moderate for good quality pecans. Prices are about steady.

The weather forecast for the balance of the week calls for low temperatures in the low 20s to low 40s, with highs in the low 50s to low 70s. No precipitation is projected for the remainder of the week.

Industry sources report that this year's harvest is ninety percent complete and marketed.

Buying interest displayed by end users was fairly light for in-shell, gift pack use, and moderate for commercial sheller use as shellers continue to utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas. Trading was slow for in-shell and gift pack uses. Deliveries and purchases of Improved varieties mostly Western Schley were moderate. Interest from the export trade business to China has been shown by prospective buyers.
