PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta, GA)

Deliveries were light and the market is trending lower. Interest from the commercial shellers and accumulators for domestic trading is moderate to slow, while the export and retail gift-pack businesses are slow. Some offerings have gone into cold storage to be sold later. Growers are about finished cleaning up the last of their lots including B grades and seconds and sending them to market. Most of the commercial buyers are open 3 days a week or have closed for the year.

Weather conditions in Georgia for the week has freezing temps and possible snow flurries in the northern areas and cool temps with rain expected in other areas of the state, then warming up for the weekend.

Blends with 42-48% meat yield (nut count 60-75) sold in a range of about \$3.80-4.30 per point. Large lots of export quality Blends sold higher, but offerings were insufficient to establish market prices.

OKLAHOMA (via: Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Market News Service)

Deliveries by growers moderate to fairly active in southern counties, light in northern Oklahoma. Pecan harvesting is complete but many growers and accumulators still have pecans in the barn. Demand was good statewide. Many out-of-state buyers have closed for the year. Sheller demand mostly moderate.

The weather forecast this week calling for highs in low 60s to mid-30s and lows in low 20s to mid-40s.

Prices paid to growers (noon Tuesday, January 09, 2017 to noon Tuesday, January 16, 2018) at buyers delivery points or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound, in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

TEXAS (Central, South, Eastern Areas, via: Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points were very light. Demand was fairly good for good quality pecans. Natives are currently being harvested. Harvesting is expected to remain light, and most are finishing up harvesting for the season. Harvested quality has been variable.

Demand was fairly good for the retail and gift pack trade. Buyers have been making purchases from other production areas or are waiting for additional availability of pecans.

The weather forecast for the next week calls for a wide range in temperatures, with lows ranging from the low 10s to low 60s, and highs ranging from the upper 20s to low 70s. There is a chance of precipitation in most regions of the state from Friday, January 19 through Sunday, January 21, with as high as an 80 percent chance in some areas.

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Natives/Seedlings (deliveries very light) machine harvested 38-42% meat yield 125-155 mostly 140-150 occasional higher and lower yard tree lots 80-120 mostly 80-100 occasional higher and lower

ARIZONA, NEW MEXICO AND WEST TEXAS (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were fairly light. Demand was fairly good for good quality pecans. Harvesting is expected to remain steady during the next week, with harvesting expected to continue through most of the month. Harvested quality has been generally good.

The weather forecast for the next week calls for low temperatures in the low 20s to low 40s, with highs in the low 40s to upper 60s. A 0-40 percent chance of precipitation is projected for Saturday, January 20, while no precipitation is projected for other days this week.

Buying interest displayed by end users was moderate for in-shell, gift pack use, and moderate for commercial sheller use as shellers continue to utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas or wait for additional availability of nuts. Trading was moderate for in-shell and gift pack uses. Deliveries and purchases of Improved varieties mostly Western Schley were moderate. Many growers are deferring making marketing decisions, opting instead to concentrate on harvesting and storing nuts for later sale.

THE FORMULA TO FIGURE OUT CENTS PER POUND AND DOLLARS PER POINT:

CENTS PER POUND DIVIDED BY MEAT YIELD EQUALS DOLLAR PER POINT

DOLLAR PER POINT TIMES MEAT YIELD EQUALS CENTS PER POUND
