TEXAS (via Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were very light. Demand was good for good quality pecans. Harvesting has been very light, and is expected to continue to slow down, as most growers across the state are completing their harvest for the season.

The weather forecast for the next week calls for low temperatures ranging from the upper 20s to upper 50s, and highs from the low 50s to mid-70s. There is a chance of precipitation every day from Tuesday, January 19 through Thursday, January 21. The greatest chance of precipitation in the coming week is on Thursday, January 21, where some areas have an 80% chance of precipitation.

Deliveries and offerings have been very light. The harvest in Texas is generally finished for the season. Some growers are holding their remaining pecans in storage, planning to sell at a later date.

WESTERN REGION - ARIZONA, NEW MEXICO AND WEST TEXAS (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were fairly light. Demand was good for good quality pecans. Harvested quality has been generally good. The season continuing to wind down, and harvesting is expected to be generally done by the end of January.

The weather forecast for the next week calls for low temperatures in the mid-20s to low 40s, with highs in the mid-50s to low 70s. There is no precipitation projected during the next week.

Buying interest displayed by end users was fairly good for in-shell, gift pack use, and fairly good for commercial sheller use as shellers continue to utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas or wait for additional availability of nuts. Trading was fairly good for in-shell and gift pack uses. Deliveries and purchases of Improved varieties mostly Western Schley were moderate.

Prices paid to growers (noon Tuesday, January 12 through noon Tuesday, January 19, 2016) at buyers delivery point or f.o.b. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality pecans in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.
