# PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

The weather forecast for the next week in South Georgia calls for low temperatures in the low 30s to mid-50s, and highs in the low 50s to low 70s. A 40-50% chance of precipitation is projected for Friday, January 8, and a 40-70% chance of precipitation is projected for Saturday, January 9.

The weather forecast for the next week in Central and North Georgia calls for low temperatures in the mid-20s to mid-50s, and highs in the upper 40s to upper 60s. A 20-40% chance of precipitation is projected for Friday, January 8, and an 80-100% chance of precipitation is projected for Saturday, January 9.

Deliveries were light and some growers are starting to finish for the season.

Buying interest is fairly good for export quality pecans and for good quality pecans. For the wholesale and gift pack trade demand is fairly light. There is a wide range in quality of pecans.

Blends in both small and large lots of generally good quality with meat yields of 40-44% sold for about 4.20-4.60 per point. Lots of Blends with meat yields of 35-39% sold for about 3.00-3.80 per point. (To get price per pound use this formula: dollars per point times meat yield = cents per pound; to get per point figure: dollars per pound divided by meat yield = dollars per point).

Prices paid to growers (Tuesday, January 5 through Thursday, January 7, 2016) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality pecans in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

#### OKLAHOMA (via: Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Market News Service)

Deliveries by growers to buying points were moderate in south central Oklahoma, and light in east and northeast counties. Heavy rainfall in December stopped harvest for some time and some growers lost a good portion of their crop to flooding. Buyers are becoming increasingly cautious toward quality and condition as both quality and meat yields are varying widely.

The weather forecast this week calling for highs in the low 50s early but dropping to the mid-30s by week's end. Lows are forecast in the mid to upper 20s.

Demand very good for seedlings in good condition. Retail and gift box demand diminished as supplies of improved varieties largely finished.

Prices paid to growers (noon Thursday, December 17, 2015 to noon Thursday January 7, 2016) at buyers delivery points or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound, in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

Natives/Seedlings (deliveries moderate) yard tree lots 35-38% meat yield 80-100, few lots over 500 lbs 120-130. Truckload lots 38-40% meat yield 145-175.
