PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

The weather forecast through Thursday, November 12 in South Georgia projects low temperatures in the low 40s to mid-50s, highs in the mid-60s to mid-70s, and a 10 percent chance of precipitation on Thursday, November 12. During the past week, the region received from 1 to 4 inches of rain.

The weather forecast through Thursday, November 12 in Central and North Georgia projects low temperatures in the low to upper 50s, highs in the upper 60s to low 80s, and a 10 percent chance of precipitation on Thursday, November 12. During the past week, the region received from 1 to 2 inches of rain.

Buying interest is active for export quality pecans and for good quality pecans. For the wholesale and gift pack trade demand is stronger as the holiday season approaches. Light but increasing sales were reported this week.

Blends in both small and large lots of generally good quality with meat yields of 45-50% sold for about \$3.70-4.13 per point. Schley Blends of gift pack quality with 52-54% meat yields sold for about \$4.25-4.40 per point. Stuart Blends with meat yields of 43-45% sold for about \$3.80 per point. Moneymaker Blends with 38-40% meat yields sold for about \$3.05-3.10 per point. (To get price per pound use this formula: dollars per point times meat yield = cents per pound; to get per point figure: dollars per pound divided by meat yield = dollars per point).

Prices paid to growers (Thursday, November 5 through Tuesday, November 10, 2015) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality pecans in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.
