PRICES PAID TO GROWERS GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

The temperatures for this week will show mild temps in the low 70s cooling down to the mid-30s with rain expected for today and tomorrow clearing up by Thursday. The excess rain has caused some of the pecans to start showing a little more rot and growers are busy cleaning up the lots before heading to the markets.

Some growers are withholding their pecans until they can come to an agreement on price and may put them into cold storage for later sales. Door sales are slow and some offerings are being docked for excess moisture and embryo rot.

Offerings of small lots mostly Stuart Blends with 45-56% meat yield sold in a range of about \$3.61-3.89 per point. Other small lots of Moneymaker/Stuart Blends with 40% meat yield sold for about \$2.67-3.38 per point. Large lots of Stuart Blends and 47-52% meat yield sold in a range of about \$3.60-3.80 per point, 44-45% meat yield \$3.30-3.50 per point and 40-42% meat yield \$3.00-3.20 per point.

The retail gift pack business and the domestic trade is fairly active, as they are busy purchasing from other areas to fill orders until the volume increases. The export trade is expected to increase but is still slow to materialize at this time. Prices paid to growers (late afternoon November 8, 2018 thru late afternoon November 13, 2018) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

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LOUISIANA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

Excess moisture from the rain and the slow harvest time to get the pecans ready for market has caused a few problems with embryo rot and black rot. Very light shipments have come in and growers are working overtime to get the pecans cleaned up and sold.

Temperatures for the week shows a cooling trend with evening lows in the low 30s and rising up to the low 50s for early next week. Daytime highs from the mid-40s and going up to the mid-60s with no rain expected at a two percent chance.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon November 6, 2018 thru late afternoon November 13, 2018) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

TEXAS (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

TEXAS (Central, South, Eastern Areas)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were very light. Demand was good for good quality pecans. Pawnee, Cheyenne and Choctaw are currently being harvested, as well as Natives. Harvesting is expected to increase seasonally.

The weather forecast for the coming week calls for low temperatures from the low 20s to mid-50s, with high temperatures in the low 40s to low 70s. There is a 0-10% chance of precipitation on Saturday, November 17, and a 0-50% chance of precipitation on Sunday, November 18.

The retail gift pack market is active. Due to very light volumes, buyers are making purchases from other production areas or are waiting for additional availability of pecans.

Pawnee (deliveries light) 50-55% meat yield 220-250 mostly 220-230 occasional higher and lower

Natives/Seedlings (deliveries light) yard tree lots 80-100 mostly 85-90 occasional lower; machine harvested 95-110 mostly 95-100

OKLAHOMA (via: Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Market News Service)

Pecan harvesting remains very slow. Deliveries by growers to buying points are extremely light. Demand was good for good quality pecans. Oklahoma had the first hard freeze and snow of the year this week. Wet weather and muddy conditions hampering harvest. Improved varieties are moving directly to the retail and gift box trade.

The weather forecast this week calling for highs in lower 60s to mid 40s and lows in mid 30s to mid 20s.

Prices paid to growers (noon Tuesday, November 6, 2018 to noon Tuesday, November 13, 2018) at buyers delivery points or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound, in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.
