PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta, GA)

Deliveries were moderate and the market is about steady or slightly higher with the exception of Stuarts being slightly lower. Interest from commercial shellers and accumulators for the domestic market has increased slightly, and retail gift-pack businesses are fairly active. Interest from the export markets has increased recently. Some growers have withheld their offerings to see if the market holds or changes upward.

Weather conditions for this week in South Georgia calls for daytime temperatures in the low 60s to low 70s with evening and early morning temps in the 40s to 50s. In the Central and Northern areas of the state the forecast calls for daytime temps in the 60s to 70s with evening and morning temps in the high 30s to low 40s. Rain expected throughout the state over the weekend of November 18-19.

Blends of Desirables of export quality pecans with 50-52% meat yield (nut count 45-50) sold in a range of about \$5.00-5.40 per point with few high as \$5.76 per point. Export quality Stuart Blends with 45-48% meat yield (nut count 49-60) sold in a range of about \$5.21-5.84 per point, while other Stuart Blends (nut count 85-90) sold for about \$4.40-4.50 per point. Schley Blends 50-55% meat yield (nut count 60-75) sold in a range of about \$4.30-4.60 per point mostly \$4.40-4.50 per point. Other Blends of Seedlings with 40-42% meat yield (nut count 80-90) sold for about \$3.70-3.90 per point.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon November 14, through late afternoon November 16, 2017) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

CENTS PER POUND DIVIDED BY MEAT YIELD EQUALS DOLLAR PER POINT

DOLLAR PER POINT TIME MEAT YIELD EQUALS CENTS PER POUND
