PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

Weather conditions for the next week in central and north Georgia growing areas call for evening lows in the mid-30s and daytime highs in the high 50s to low 60s. The southern part of the state is expected to be much warmer during the day and colder in the late evenings.

Most of the exports destined for the Chinese New Year markets are currently being shipped out. Contracts are being prepared and signed for January shipments for the Asian markets.

Demand is very strong for both the export trade and domestic retail gift-pack business. Prices are lower for Blends and Improved varieties and about steady for yard tree lots.

Offerings were moderate to fairly light at the delivery buying points. Most of the lots were comprised of Blends with a few Cape Fear, Desirables, Moneymakers, Schley, Stuart and Sumner hitting the markets.

Small lots of Blends with meat yields of 51-52% (nut count 51-54) sold in a range of about \$4.63-5.58 mostly \$4.67-4.80 per point. Lots with 45-53% (nut count 60-75) sold in a range of about \$4.50-5.11 per point mostly \$4.57-4.86 per point.

Large lots of export quality Blends with 47% meat yield or better sold in a range of about \$5.19-5.21 per point. Other lots with 47% meat yield or better (nut count 54-60) sold in a range of about \$4.59-4.80 per point and lots with meat yields of 45-53% (nut count 60-75) sold in a range of about \$4.50-480 per point mostly \$4.60-4.80 per point.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon Tuesday, November 14, through late afternoon Thursday, November 17, 2016) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

OKLAHOMA (via: Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Market News Service)

Deliveries by growers to buying points extremely light with harvest just getting underway. Movement of small lots of hand-picked pecans very light and only a few sales of machine harvested natives confirmed. Buyers cautious toward quality but so far early offerings are average. Only northern and north central counties have received first frost.

The weather forecast this week calling for highs in the mid-50s to mid-60s, lows in low to mid-30s.

Demand was fairly good for the limited offerings. Retail and gift box demand is fairly good and many growers expected to direct market this year.

Prices paid to growers (as of noon Tuesday, November 8, 2016 to noon Thursday, November 17, 2016) at buyers delivery points or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound, in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

Natives/Seedlings (deliveries very light) few sales of machine harvested 35-38% meat yield 150 to 165, yard tree lots 35-38% meat yield 75-85.
