PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta, GA)

Deliveries were light to moderate this week. Prices are trending to be lower, but remain about steady. Commercial shellers are waiting for the market to settle, while export sales and retail gift-pack businesses are active.

Weather conditions for this week throughout the state are forecast to be rather mild with daytime temps in the mid to high 70s and evening and morning temps in the mid to low 50s. A slight possibility of rain scattered throughout for the weekend.

Some lots are reported to have some black rot showing on the edges and are priced and sold for less. Lots with nice color to the pecans and full body of meat are bringing in the higher dollar per pound and per point.

Deliveries of small lots of Blends under 20,000 pounds sold in a range of about \$4.46-5.47 per point. Large lots of Blends including truckloads with 48% meat yield or better (nut count mid 40s) sold in a range of about \$5.81-6.46 mostly \$5.94-6.20 per point.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon October 31, through late afternoon November 02, 2017) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.
