PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta, GA)

Deliveries were light and the market is lower. Interest from the commercial shellers and accumulators for domestic trading has slowed as well as interest from the export market; while retail giftpack businesses are fairly active. Trading is expected to be slow this week, as the market continues to shift.

Some growers have decided to withhold offerings and put them into cold storage until the price settles or improves. Most of the Southern areas are at least 90-95 percent finished harvesting for the year and the Central and Northern areas are close behind.

Weather conditions in South Georgia shows lows in the mid-50s and daytime highs in the low to mid-70s. In the Central and Northern areas of the state the forecast calls for daytime temps in the mid-60s with evening and morning temps in the low 40s. A slight chance of rain possible.

Small and large lots of Blends with Desirables and 49-52% meat yield (nut count under 50) sold in a range of about \$4.90-5.31 mostly \$5.00-5.20 per point. Blends of Schley with 50-53% meat yield (nut count 60-75) sold for about \$4.40-4.50 per point.

LOUISIANA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta, GA)

Growers are busy accumulating pecans and preparing them for market. Very light deliveries this week. The market is about steady. Most of the sales are sold as retail off the farm.

The weather forecast throughout most of the state for this week calls for mild temperatures with lows in the 50s and highs in the 70s with rain expected on November 29 through December 1.

OKLAHOMA (via: Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Market News Service)

Pecan harvesting is active statewide with dry weather and mostly average to above average temperatures facilitating harvest. Marketing mostly moderate in northern counties, moderate to active in southern and central Oklahoma. Sheller demand mostly moderate. Deliveries by growers to buying points this week mostly moderate though seller inquiry fairly active late. Buyers extremely cautious toward quality as a great deal of lower yielding seedlings are being offered.

The weather forecast this week calling for highs in low 70s to Mid 50s and lows in mid 50s to LOW 30s. Very slight chance of rain is in the forecast for the week.

TEXAS (Central, South, Eastern Areas)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were light. Demand was good for good quality pecans. Harvesting is expected to remain about steady this week, and to increase next week. Much buying interest continues for the export trade to China.

Demand was fairly good for the retail and gift pack trade. Due to continued light volumes, buyers are making purchases from other production areas or are waiting for additional availability of pecans.

Weather forecast for this week shows lows in the low 40s to low 50s and highs in the mid to upper 70s. On Saturday, December 2 and Sunday, December 3, there is a 10-20 percent chance of precipitation across most of the state.
