GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

Weather conditions call for mostly mild temperatures over the next several days with evening lows in the high 40s to low 50s and daytime highs in the high 70s to low 80s with very little chance of rain.

Buyers and shippers are frantically putting together lots to be shipped to Asia to arrive by November 15 for the Chinese New Year markets.

Demand for large good quality pecans is very strong for both the export trade and domestic retail gift business. Prices are higher for Blends while others remain about steady.

Large lots of Stuart Blends with meat yields of 47-48.5% (nut count in the low 50s) brought in about \$5.71-5.89 per point. Other lots with meat yields of around 49-54.5% (68-72 nut count) brought in about \$5.01-5.24 per point. Moneymaker Blends with 45-49.5% meat yield (60 nut count) brought in about \$4.97-5.48 per point.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon Tuesday, November 1, through late afternoon Thursday, November 3, 2016) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.
