PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park, Georgia) Atlanta

Temperature lows in the southern part of the state ranged in the mid to high 50s with highs into the low to mid 70s. Northern areas were much cooler in the evenings over the weekend. Daytime temperatures ranged in the low 50s to highs up to the mid 60s. Rain was reported in many areas late Thursday and into Friday.

Most of the sales this week were from Blends. Lots with low unit counts/ large nuts of export and gift pack quality command the highest prices. Lots of Blends in fair condition or high unit count/smaller nut sold in a range of about \$2.19-2.80 per point, lots of generally good quality and condition sold in a range of about \$3.21-4.41 mostly \$3.75-4.00 per point. Lots of export quality sold in a range of about \$5.17-5.64 per point.

Buying interest and trading by end users is strong for export and gift pack retail business, while moderate from shellers and accumulators. Deliveries of Improved varieties included a few Desirables, Elliott, Moneymakers and Schley.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon Thursday, October 31 thru late afternoon Tuesday, November 5, 2013) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

LOUISIANA - Reporting once weekly-usually on Tuesdays - Via: Forest Park, Georgia (Atlanta)

Deliveries for Improved varieties are too few to establish market prices for large lots, while yard tree lots are very light. Estimates of the volume for this season's crop is expected to be very low as compared to previous recent years. Growers are expected to start harvesting in the next week or two.

Prices paid to growers at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell for yard tree lots less than 20,000 pounds mostly 5,000 or less unless otherwise stated.
