PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

High temperatures mixed in with rain pretty much sums up the last month as growers were busy getting the orchard floors prepared for the pecan season as it gets underway this week. The good news is that the Hurricane season has started and so far the pecans in Georgia are in fairly good shape and have avoided the catastrophe of the last couple of years.

The Pawnees are coming off the trees and hitting the markets now and other varieties will be coming in soon. Many of the shellers and accumulators are just now preparing to open their doors to the public for sales and purchases and most should be ready by mid-October. Prices are starting out a little stronger this year as compared to last year's opening prices and growers are selling rather than holding onto them.

The weather for this week and early next week for much of the state shows warm days in the 90s cooling down to the mid-80s with evening lows in the 60s and the possibility of rain expected around October 7-8.

Prices paid to growers (September 24 through late afternoon October 1, 2019) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.
