PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta, GA)

The season is finally getting underway, but the pecans are slowly coming in. Growers are taking the extra time to clean up and prepare the lots for sale. Demand is strong and prices remain about steady.

Some growers are still signing contracts for the season and buyers looking for export quality pecans are scouring the areas to fill orders needed for this year. The Asian markets are still growing and a new wave of buyers may be coming in. Unable to or unwilling to compete for the larger nuts, these buyers are looking at smaller sizes and the B grades in hopes of creating a market for them and new customers looking for a lower price.

Weather conditions for this week call for mild daytime temperatures in the high 70s and low 80s and evening temps in the high 50s or low 60s.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon October 12, through late afternoon October 17, 2017) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

LOUISIANA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta, GA)

Very light shipments of yard tree lots coming in from the Southern areas of the state. In the Central and North areas no deliveries reported. Some growers are working in the orchards this week and preparing to harvest. Heavy rains, wind and wet conditions have put a damper on harvest and production to start this year.

This is the first report for Louisiana pecans.
