PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

Temperatures for the past week in South Georgia ranged from lows in the upper 40s to low 60s, and highs in the mid-70s to mid-80s. The forecast through Thursday calls for lows in the low 60s to low 70s, with highs in the low 70s to low 80s. Precipitation is expected in the area, with a 60-100 percent chance of precipitation on Tuesday, October 27, 50-60 percent chance of precipitation on Wednesday, October 28, and a 10 percent chance of precipitation on Thursday, October 29.

Temperatures for the past week in Central and North Georgia ranged from lows in the mid-30s to mid-50s, and highs in the low 70s to mid-80s. The forecast through Thursday calls for lows in the upper 40s to upper 50s, with highs in the upper 50s to upper 70s. Precipitation is expected in the area, with a 60 percent chance of precipitation on Tuesday, October 27 and Wednesday, October 28, and a 10-20 percent chance of precipitation on Thursday, October 29.

Buying interest displayed by end users was good for in-shell gift pack use, export quality pecans, and good quality smaller sized pecans, while moderate for others.

Prices paid to growers (October 20 through October 27, 2015) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality. Very light sales were reported. Prices include trailer

load lots and lots under 20,000 pounds.
