## PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

### GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

The pecan season has started this week with the harvesting of Pawnee in South Georgia. No price quotes to establish market. Some growers have contracted out their pecans for the export business covering the Chinese New Year deadlines for shipping. First F.O.B. prices expected to be issued on Tuesday, October 4, 2016.

The growers are still cleaning up the orchards from Hurricane Hermine and the storms that travelled through the Southern areas of the state earlier in the month. Several areas were hit with high winds and rains causing trees to topple over that were heavy with pecans. Total estimated losses of trees and nuts have not been established yet. Some reports have estimated that up to 10,000 trees may have been lost or damaged. The crop is considered to be a very good one this year with volumes estimated at between 95-105 million pounds depending upon how much loss has actually occurred.

The American Pecan Council has been formed to establish marketing agreements and to secure information on pecans grown domestically across the country. At this time ballots are being collected to establish a board of directors and implement the program.
