PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

Growers are still cleaning up in the orchards and preparing the pecans to be picked up and cleaned for sale in the next week. Pawnee are hitting the market with several varieties close behind. Soon to be harvested are Caddo, Creek, Excel, Oconee and Schley could be ready in about a week. Desirables and Moneymakers are about ready to be harvested and Stuarts are looking good. This year many varieties could be hitting the markets about the same time, making for some interesting choices all at once. The weather is mild and should be a little warmer for this weekend. Contract sales are moderate this year with growers optimistic about the prices and some are waiting to see what the market trends to before deciding on signing. Early indications are that the export trade business is going to be busy looking for and purchasing top quality pecans this year.

Most accumulators and shellers are open this week and business is slow. That is expected to change by this weekend when other varieties and yard sales pick up and hit the markets.

Prices paid to growers (September 28 through late afternoon October 3, 2017) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.
