## PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta, GA)

Temperature lows for this weekend throughout Georgia range from the low to mid 30s and high 40s to temperature highs of high 50s to low to mid70s. Mostly sunny with some wind and very light precipitation expected in some areas.

Buying interest displayed by end users was good for in-shell gift pack use and for export quality pecans. Interest from commercial shellers is moderate as buyers are trying to determine what price they can work with for purchases. A lighter crop is expected and second shakings may not produce as many pounds as previously estimated, while the size of the pecans appear to be smaller than in previous years. Some areas, especially unirrigated orchards have scab as being a problem. Many growers have opted to put their orchards on contract sales.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon Tuesday, October 28, 2014 thru late afternoon Thursday, October 30, 2014) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

**Cape Fear** (deliveries very light) export quality 50% meat yield or better 250-251, 49-50% meat yield 175

**Moneymaker** (deliveries very light) (under 70 count) 43-44% meat yield 180-201, (over 80 count) 45-48% meat yield 93-110

**Seedlings** (deliveries very light) yard tree lots 60-75 mostly 60 occasional higher for large sized pecans

**Stuart** (deliveries very light) yard tree lots 100-150 mostly 100-125

Lots in excess of 20,000 pounds including trailer load lots:

**Cape Fear** (deliveries very light) export quality 50-54% meat yield mostly 290

**Desirables** (deliveries very light) export quality 50-53% meat yield 300-302

**Moneymaker** (deliveries very light) 45-48% meat yield 180-200

**Pawnee** (deliveries insufficient to establish market)

**Schley** (deliveries very light) 55-58% meat yield 180-200

**Stuart** (deliveries very light) export quality 48-50% meat yield 235-246
