PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park, Georgia) Atlanta

Temperatures throughout the state ranged in the low 50s to mid 60s with highs into the mid 70s to low 80s. Deliveries have to this date still been fairly light. Lots with low nut counts and larger pecans of export and gift pack quality command the highest prices. Lots of Blends were too few to establish market price.

Buying interest and trading by end users is strong for export and gift pack retail business, while moderate from shellers and accumulators. Deliveries of Improved varieties offered included a few Desirables, Moneymakers, Schley and Stuart.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon Tuesday, October 29 thru late afternoon Thursday, October 31, 2013) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

Stuart 46-50% meat yield 220-240 yard tree lots 70-80

Prices paid to growers at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell for yard tree lots less than 20,000 pounds mostly 5,000 or less unless otherwise stated.
