PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

After cleaning up the orchards and accessing damages from the last storms that recently came through, the growers are preparing for another round of storms to come in the next week. Currently, Hurricane Mathew has passed through Haiti and is heading up toward the eastern coast from Florida up to the Carolinas.

Buyers are expected to open their doors for open trading including yard tree sales around October 15. No prices have been established for the door sales yet and contracts are under way now for both domestic and export sales. The 2016 crop appears to be heavy in volume in most areas, with a general feeling of optimism for a good outcome for price and total pounds produced.

Prices paid to growers (September 29 through October 4, 2016) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality. Very light sales of Pawnee were reported with some under contract.

Pawnee (deliveries very light) insufficient deliveries to establish market price.
