#### PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

**GEORGIA** (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

This week started off with freezing temps throughout the state with wind chill factors bringing it down into the teens. The rest of the week has evening and early morning temps in 30s to mid-40s with daytime temperatures in the low 50s to high 60s. The north areas will be slightly cooler and rain may be expected Saturday and Sunday. Growers are about ninety percent finished with harvesting and sources report about fifty percent has been sold with the rest that are of good quality and size to be stored for sale later. Prices are about steady and interest has increased as the push for holiday retail and domestic sales has come into play.

Large lots of Blends with Desirables (nut count 45-53) meat yield 49-52% sold in a range of about \$2.65-2.70 per point (nut count 47-53) meat yield 46-47% sold in a range of about \$2.50-2.60 per point. Small lots of Desirable Blends (nut count 70-84) meat yield 48-52% sold for about \$2.29-2.59 per point. Stuart Blends (nut count 50-65) meat yield 46-51% sold in a range of about \$2.40-2.60 per point (nut count 50-70) meat yield 44-46% sold in a range of about \$2.11-2.51 mostly \$2.30-2.40 per point and 40-43% meat yield sold in a range of about \$2.00-2.20 per point. Other small lots of Blends with (nut count 56-63) meat yield 47-53% sold in a range of about \$2.27-2.66 per point.

#### OKLAHOMA (via: Phoenix, Arizona) (602) 514-7210

Pecan harvest was fairly light, and is expected to increase during the upcoming weeks in December. Deliveries by growers to buying points are light. Demand was moderate for good quality pecans. Gift box and retail trade continue to look out of state for supplies.

The weather forecast this week calls for high temperatures from the low 40s to mid-70s and low temperatures from the low 20s to low 50s. There is a 25 to 55 percent chance of precipitation on Friday, December 11, and a 15 to 30 percent chance of precipitation on Saturday, December 12.

Prices paid to growers (from noon Tuesday, December 1, 2020 through noon Tuesday, December 8, 2020) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound, in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

Natives/Seedlings (deliveries light) yard tree lots 40-55 mostly 40-50

#### THE NEXT OKLAHOMA REPORT IS SCHEDULED TO BE RELEASED ON TUESDAY, DECEMBER 15, 2020.

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TEXAS (Central, South, Eastern Areas) (602) 514-7210

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were fairly light. Demand was moderate for good quality pecans. Cheyenne and Choctaw are currently being harvested, as well as Natives. Harvesting is expected to increase during the weeks leading up to Christmas.

The weather forecast for the coming week calls for low temperatures from the low 30s to low 60s, with high temperatures from the low 50s to low 80s. There is a slight chance of precipitation every day this week across the state, peaking on Friday, December 11 at 45 to 75 percent chance of precipitation across much of the state.

The retail gift pack market is fairly active. Due to very light volumes, buyers are making purchases from other production areas or are waiting for additional availability of pecans.

## THE NEXT TEXAS REPORT IS SCHEDULED TO BE RELEASED ON TUESDAY, DECEMBER 15, 2020.

#### ARIZONA, NEW MEXICO AND WEST TEXAS (via Phoenix, Arizona) (602) 514-7210

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were very light but increasing. Demand was fairly good for good quality pecans. Harvesting is in its early stages, but is expected to increase seasonally. Harvested quality has been generally good.

The weather forecast for the next week calls for low temperatures in the low 20s to low 40s with highs in the low 50s to low 70s. There is a 30 to 65 percent chance of precipitation on Thursday, December 10.

Buying interest displayed by end users was fairly active for in-shell, gift pack use, and moderate for commercial sheller use as shellers continue to utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas or wait for additional availability of nuts. Trading was moderate for in-shell and gift pack uses. Deliveries and purchases of Improved varieties mostly Western Schley were light. Some growers are deferring making marketing decisions, opting instead to concentrate on harvesting and storing nuts for later sale.
