OKLAHOMA (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

Pecan harvest continues to be active, and is expected to remain so during the upcoming week. Deliveries by growers to buying points are moderate. Demand was good for good quality pecans. Prices are slightly higher.

The weather forecast this week calls for high temperatures from the low 40s to the mid-60s and low temperatures from the low 20s to the low 50s. There is a 0-20 percent chance of precipitation on Tuesday, January 14 and Wednesday, January 15, a 20-90 percent chance of precipitation on Thursday, January 16, and an 80-100 percent chance of precipitation on Friday, January 17.

Prices paid to growers (from noon Tuesday, January 7, 2020 through noon Tuesday, January 14, 2020) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound, in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

Natives/Seedlings (deliveries moderate) yard tree lots 90-110 mostly 100-110 occasional higher and lower

TEXAS (via: Phoenix, Arizona) (Central, South, Eastern Areas)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were moderate. Demand was good for good quality pecans. Natives are currently being harvested. Harvesting is expected to increase slightly during the upcoming week.

The weather forecast for the coming week calls for low temperatures from the low 30s to upper 60s, with high temperatures from the mid-40s to the low 80s. There is a 20-60 percent chance of precipitation on Wednesday, January 15 and Thursday, January 16, and a 40-90 percent chance of precipitation on Friday, January 17.

Buying interest displayed by end users was moderate for commercial sheller use as shellers continue to utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas or wait for additional availability of nuts. Trading was fairly active for in-shell and gift pack uses. Many growers are deferring making marketing decisions, opting instead to concentrate on harvesting and storing nuts for later sale.

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were moderate. Demand was good for good quality pecans. Harvested quality has been variable. Prices are slightly higher.

The weather forecast for the next week calls for low temperatures in the low 30s to upper 40s with highs in the mid-40s to low 70s. There is a 20-70 percent chance of precipitation on Thursday, January 16, and a 10 percent chance of precipitation on Friday, January 17.

Buying interest displayed by end users was fairly good for in-shell, gift pack use, and moderate for commercial sheller use as shellers continue to utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas or wait for additional availability of nuts. Trading was fairly active for in-shell and gift pack uses. Deliveries and purchases of Improved varieties mostly Western Schley were fairly light. Many growers are deferring making marketing decisions, opting instead to concentrate on harvesting and storing nuts for later sale.
