OKLAHOMA (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to buying points was very light. Harvest is nearing completion for the season. Demand was moderate.

The preliminary National Agricultural Statistics Service report for the 2019 season reports that Oklahoma produced 19,800,000 pounds of pecans (15,940,000 Natives/Seedlings, 3,960,000 Improved varieties).

The weather forecast this week calls for high temperatures from the upper 30s to the low 70s and low temperatures from the mid-20s to the low 50s. There is a 90-100 percent chance of precipitation on Tuesday, January 28, and a 0-10 percent chance of precipitation the rest of the week.

Deliveries by growers to delivery points was very light. Harvest is nearing completion for the season. Demand was moderate.

The preliminary National Agricultural Statistics Service report for the 2019 season reports that Texas produced 42,600,000 pounds of pecans (36,400,000 improved varieties, 6,200,000 Natives/Seedlings).

The weather forecast this week calls for high temperatures from the mid-40s to the mid-70s and low temperatures from the low 30s to the low 60s. There is as high as a 40 percent chance of precipitation on Thursday, January 30 and Friday, January 31.

Prices paid to growers (from noon Tuesday, January 21, 2020 through noon Tuesday, January 28, 2020) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound, in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.

WESTERN REGION: ARIZONA, NEW MEXICO AND WEST TEXAS (via: Phoenix, Arizona)

Deliveries by growers to delivery points of Improved varieties were light. Demand was good for good quality pecans. Harvesting in New Mexico as well as the El Paso area are 85-90 percent completed. Harvested quality has been variable.

The preliminary National Agricultural Statistics Service report for the 2019 season reports that Arizona produced 36,500,000 pounds of improved variety pecans, and New Mexico produced 96,600,000 pounds of improved variety pecans, making New Mexico the largest pecan producing state in 2019.

The weather forecast for the next week calls for low temperatures in the mid-20s to low 40s with highs in the mid-40s to the low 70s. There is a 10-20 percent chance of precipitation on Thursday, January 30.

Buying interest displayed by end users was moderate for in-shell, gift pack use, and moderate for commercial sheller use as shellers continue to utilize inventories on hand or make purchases from other production areas or wait for additional availability of nuts. Trading was moderate for in-shell and gift pack uses. Deliveries and purchases of Improved varieties mostly Western Schley were light. Many growers are deferring making marketing decisions, opting instead to concentrate on harvesting and storing nuts for later sale.
