## PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

The weather for this week is going from mild temps with rain and cooling down with evening lows in the 30s for much of the week and daytime highs in the low 60s to low 70s as a cold front pushes across the state on Thursday with cold temps hanging on for the rest of the week with high wind advisories and possible tornado activity.

Offerings were light this week as buyers and sellers are waiting to see how the market will settle in the next few days and if prices will continue to be lower or rebound after having prices for Mexican pecans drop this week. The retail and holiday gift markets are about steady and remain strong while the domestic market has softened.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon October 29, 2019 through late afternoon October 31, 2019) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated.
