PRICES PAID TO GROWERS

GEORGIA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta, GA)

Rain expected mostly for the whole week with mild daytime temps in the mid-70s and cooling down to the low 60s by next Monday. Central Georgia will cool down into the 40s with rain for Saturday through Tuesday and the North areas will have intermittent rain during the week and cold evenings in the 40s and mid-30s.

Shellers are cutting back on their hours of operation and some are taking in yard tree offerings three days a week. Prices have increased this week for Improved varieties as more export quality pecans are hitting the market now and hopefully will find buyers quickly as the pecan season is coming to an end all around the country and in Georgia as well. Prices for Blends dropped this week. Growers have gone into the orchards and cleaned them up as much as they could before the rains come in all week collecting pecans and keeping them out of the wet conditions. Most are done working in the orchards and are concentrating on sorting sizes and cleaning up the lots before offering them for sale.

Prices for Blends dropped this week Stuart Blends (nut count 55-65) 46-50% meat yield sold in a range of about \$2.85-3.00 per point. Desirable Blends (nut count 48-55) 50-53% meat yield sold in a range of about \$2.85-3.00 per point.

LOUISIANA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta, GA)

The weather is expected to be on the mild side for days and evenings this week with rain slated for the weekend. Very light offerings for the year, with much of the commercial and retail-candy operations purchasing from other areas. Most growers are selling retail from their home businesses. Prices are holding steady. Most commercial buyers are moving along and are closing up for the year.

OKLAHOMA (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

Weather will be cool in the mid-60s for daytime and dropping to the low 50s for next week. Evenings will be freezing hovering around 30-32 degrees all week and rain showers in between the days during the week.

Prices paid to growers (late afternoon Tuesday, January 10, 2023 thru late afternoon Tuesday, January 17, 2023) at buyers delivery point or F.O.B. the orchard including direct sales to end users, cents per pound, in-shell of generally good quality in lots of 20,000 pounds or less unless otherwise stated. Very light volume available.

Natives/Seedlings (deliveries very light) machine harvested 42% or better 125 occasional higher, yard tree lots 50-70

TEXAS (Central, South, Eastern Areas) (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

Mild temps expected in the 70s cooling down to the low 60s with thunderstorms on Saturday. Evenings will be cool in the 50s and down into the 40s for the weekend. Growers are collecting their pecans hoping to have some volume to sell in late January or February. A short crop and very light volume is expected. Some growers are putting them in cold storage until prices settle down. Some commercial buyers will be closing up sooner this year than in normal years.

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ARIZONA, NEW MEXICO AND WEST TEXAS (via: Forest Park-Atlanta GA)

Arizona weather shows days in the 50s with evenings in the low 30s with possible freeze most of the evenings. In New Mexico days will be mostly partly sunny mostly in the 40s with evenings freezing into the low 20s and down to 18 degrees for next week. Not much rain is expected if any.

With a short crop and lower yields this year, many growers are selling retail online and through gift shops from home. Most are still collecting their pecans and trying to get enough volume to offer for sale later in the month or next month.

A few Blends of Western Schley with up to 60% meat yields sold in a range of about \$2.85-3.00 per point..
